From the desk of the Administrator...

Rain, rain go away, come again another day. But another day is not supposed to be EVERY day!! The rain has caused many frustrations for us and for just about everyone especially the farmers. Hopefully it will dry up soon and they can get the crops in the ground.

This month I will be talking about Recycling totes. We will be switching from the current two 16-gallon recycling bins to one 64-gallon tote. This will allow you to put your paper, cardboard, glass, tin, and aluminum all in one container. This is possible with the new recycling sorter at the Transfer Station.

Switching to the totes will also change the recycling pickup from every week to every other week. It will also bring a .43 cents per month increase in the recycling charge per household. The increase will take it from \$3.09 a month to \$3.52 a month. This will also get us an extension of our current contract with Republic Services for five more years.

Switch out will start in July. They will deliver the new totes and pick up the old bins.

Community Clean Up Day Saturday, June 22

There will be a Community Clean-Up Day offered to residents of the Village of Jackson Center on Saturday, June 22, 2019. Items can be dropped off in the parking lot on Davis St. behind Peoples Federal Savings and Loan Bank from 8 am to noon sponsored by the Village. This is a great opportunity to do household clean up.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Household garbage and waste, large item trash and junk.

LIST OF UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Appliances with Freon or dehumidifiers Auto/Petroleum Products: tires, batteries, antifreeze, oil, lubricants, fluids, gas, kerosene

Garden Products: yard waste, fertilizers, pesticides, garden chemicals

Paint/Hobby Products: liquid paint, thinners, solvents, stains, lacquer, varnish, wood stains, preservatives, paint stripper, glue, adhesives, fluorescent lights, ammunition, photographic chemical.

Grass Clippings & Yard Waste Do Not Belong In Your Trash Tote

Grass Clippings are not Permitted to be disposed of in your Trash Tote! Republic Services has reported that they have been finding trash bags full of grass clippings in trash totes. This is an Extreme Fire Hazard! Grass clippings and yard waste produce heat. This happens as a result of microscopic bacteria and fungi feeding on moist grass clippings. Freshly cut grass spread over a lawn starts to rot, but you can't feel the heat that it generates until you rake the grass into a pile. The bigger the pile, the more heat is trapped and the hotter the pile temperature. Therefore, when grass clippings are bagged, you have a large amount of clippings in a bag that is generating heat; and if that bag is broke open inside a trash truck or a compost bin, the gases produced by the grass clippings are exposed to oxygen, causing the material to ignite and catch fire (spontaneously combust).

Please do not put grass clippings in your Trash Tote.

Please do not put bags of grass in the compost container on Jerry Drive.

Do dump your grass clippings directly into the compost container on Jerry Drive.

If you have to transport your clippings to the compost container in a bag, dump the clippings directly into the container and dispose of the bag in a trash receptacle that is provided by the compost container.

The contents of the compost container are transported to Cherokee Run Landfill near Bellefontaine and added to a large compost pile
