### OLD BUSINESS:

a. ORDINANCE 2017-019 - An Ordinance Establishing Job Classifications And Rates For All Employees Of The Village Of Jackson Center, Shelby County, State Of Ohio And Declaring An Emergency. Second Reading

The Wage and Benefits Committee met on Monday, September 18th and is recommending the following revisions to this ordinance: 1) that a cell phone stipend be established for eligible part time employees of \$20 a month and eligible full time employees of \$40 a month beginning January 1, 2018; 2) adjust the maximum amount to be spent on part time Police Department compensation to \$27,040 for 2018; 3) recommendation of an increase in the salary for the Zoning Enforcement Officer from \$2,000 annually to \$5,000 annually; 4) recommendation of an increase of the Mayor's salary with the beginning of a new term from \$4,500 annually to \$6,000 annually; 5) recommendation of an increase in Council salary at the beginning of a new term from \$2,000 annually to \$3,000 annually; 6) recommendation of an increase of the Fiscal Officer's salary from \$3,844.41 annually to \$5,000 annually; 7) recommendation of an increase of the Assistant Fire Chief salary from \$1,030 annually to \$1,080 annually; 8) recommendation of an increase of the Deputy Fire Chief salary from \$1,030 annually to \$1,080 annually; 9) recommendation of a cost of living increase of two percent to be determined sometime in 2018. recommended revisions would become effective on January 1, 2018. a. ORDINANCE 2017-020 - An Ordinance To Make Appropriations For Current Expenses And Other Expenditures Of The Village Of Jackson Center, In Shelby County, And State Of Ohio, During The Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 2018 And Declaring An Emergency. First Reading

This is the first presentation of the appropriation budget for Fiscal Year 2018. To date, the total of all funds is \$7,246,744.44. The breakdown is as follows: General Fund \$1,147,479.37; Street Construction, Maintenance, and Repair \$140,439.75; State Highway Fund \$17,000; Income Tax Revenue Fund \$1,441,689.50; Community Reinvestment Fund \$1,500; Fire Engine Fund \$25,000; Police Explorer Fund \$550; Note Retirement Fund \$169,768.74; Capital Improvement Fund \$449,885.38; General Improvement Fund \$191,118.38; Water Operating Fund \$375,965.89; Sewer Operating Fund \$500,944.77; Electric Operating Fund \$2,683,632.66; Refuse Operating Fund \$75,770; Enterprise Deposit Fund \$22,000; Enterprise On Account Clearing Fund \$4,000.

b. **ORDINANCE 2017-021** – An Ordinance Authorizing The Village Administrator To Enter Into Contracts For The Furnishing Of Fire Protection To Territory Outside The Village Limits And Declaring An Emergency.

This is the annual Stokes Township Fire Contract that we do every year. This contract has not changed from last year. The ordinance tonight is to authorize the Village Administrator to enter into a contract for calendar year 2018. The contract is an annual sum equal to one point six (1.6) mills on the tax evaluation of the Township, less county auditor fees.
