**Police Chief:** Klopfenstein stated that we did interview a potential part time officer tonight. We will follow up with you all on that. The interview went well.

**ZEO/EDD:** CDBG Grant is having their 2nd Public Hearing on the Neighborhood Revitalization Program this Thursday, June 11<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. in the Shelby County Commissioners Office.

We received an email from the census bureau and they gave us some statistics on the response to date on the 2020 Census. Jackson Center is running really behind on the number of people that have responded to the 2020 Census. Shelby County is almost 70% with all of Ohio at about 65%. Jackson Township is at 61%, but Jackson Center is only 53% response. So they are trying to come up with some other ideas to get the information out there and let everyone know how important it is to respond to the 2020 Census. August 11th is the deadline, and then they will start going from door to door to collect the responses.

CIC will be meeting later this week to review a couple of projects.

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#### ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: June 8, 2020

##### Administrator

- ☺ Township trustees approved an additional .3 levy to be added this fall to go along with the .7 for Anna Rescue.
- ☺ Bruce has been talking with AMPO regarding the gas aggregation program, and our 24 months will be up at the first of October. We are currently at .375 right now. It looks like we will be going with AEP with a price at .346 for 24 months.
- ☺ COVID-19, we are pretty much back to normal. We have delayed late charges on the last couple of months electric bills, is it time to reinstate that? There are not hardly any other towns that are taking off the late charges now. Council briefly discussed and decided that we will start adding the late fees after the July 1<sup>st</sup> bill. Would like to get safety training back up for the guys, and get them back in the routine. We will also begin charging employees for sick leave when they take that time off. We still have Elizabeth Hickey scholarship presentation and Matt Clayton to present to. We will try to shoot for the first meeting in July 13<sup>th</sup> for these presentations.
- ☺ Sawvel did some work for us on distributive generation. That would be people wanting to put solar panels on their house or putting up wind turbines. They have that completed and Bruce will be sending it to Mr. Burton to review, and then we will bring it to council to get it adopted. We do have a little leverage within the zoning.
- ☺ Finished the paving and Reclamite and the landscapers moved in today to get the grass seeded and the pavement markings will start on Friday.
- ☺ Spoke with the railroad and we did not get the paperwork in in time to get them to be able to pave up to the tracks. We are schedule to do all five crossings with pavement up to the rail, they would like to have them done before school starts
- ☺ Thoughts on the large item trash day, would we like to do something in August. Garage sales maybe 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday in August and then the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday we could have the large item day. We will work on getting this coordinated.
- ☺ The pool is going good they should be done around the 19<sup>th</sup>. We had talked about doing a sneak peak in August, we need to have it up and running to get final inspection by the state. Do we want to try to shoot for national night out with no charge for admittance? We want to talk to the YMCA to see if we can get some for a few days. We will have some fees to the state to pay and we will have to get chemicals for a week. Council would like to try to prepare for next year to get lifeguards to work next year.
