Greetings all, it appears that spring may finally be upon us. I hope that weather has finally broke and is here to stay. I have been seeing and also receiving word from our officers that there has been an increase in unconventional vehicle use over the last couple weeks with the nicer weather. I thought that it was imperative that I share with everyone the requirements and stipulations set forth by the Ohio Revised Code for the use of unconventional vehicles on the roadways within the village limits. An unconventional vehicle is a term that is collectively used to describe the following vehicles:

1. **"Under-speed vehicle" means a three- or four-wheeled vehicle, including a vehicle commonly known as a golf cart, with an attainable speed on a paved level surface of not more than twenty miles per hour and with a gross vehicle weight rating less than three thousand pounds. (Commonly known as a golf cart)**
2. **"Low-speed vehicle" means a three- or four-wheeled motor vehicle with an attainable speed in one mile on a paved level surface of more than twenty miles per hour but not more than twenty-five miles per hour and with a gross vehicle weight rating less than three thousand pounds.**
3. **"Utility vehicle" means a self-propelled vehicle designed with a bed, principally for the purpose of transporting material or cargo in connection with construction, agricultural, forestry, grounds maintenance, lawn and garden, materials handling, or similar activities. (eg. Ranger, Razor, Gator, Kubota or other similar vehicles)**
4. **"Mini-truck" means a vehicle that has four wheels, is propelled by an electric motor with a rated power of seven thousand five hundred watts or less or an internal combustion engine with a piston displacement capacity of six hundred sixty cubic centimeters or less, has a total dry weight of nine hundred to two thousand two hundred pounds, contains an enclosed cabin and a seat for the vehicle operator, resembles a pickup truck or van with a cargo area or bed located at the rear of the vehicle, and was not originally manufactured to meet federal motor vehicle safety standards.**

All unconventional vehicles, at a minimum, must have the following properly functioning equipment:

- 1) Brakes
- 2) Brake lights (2)
- 3) Head lights (2)
- 4) Tail lights (2)
- 5) Warning devices & reflectors (eg. turn signals)
- 6) Steering mechanism
- 7) Windshield
- 8) Rearview mirror
- 9) Horn
- 10) Tires (eg. no major bumps, bulges, or unsafe condition)

Due to the fact that unconventional vehicles are classified as a motor vehicle in accordance with Ohio Revised Code section 4511.01, they must also comply with the Ohio Vehicle Licensing laws under Chapter 4503 and also the Ohio Driver's License Laws under Chapter 4507 of the Ohio Revised Code. This means that unconventional vehicles must be inspected by local law enforcement, titled by the State of Ohio and a vehicle license plate will be issued to you by the Ohio BMV. All drivers of unconventional vehicles MUST be 16 years of age and MUST possess a valid Ohio driver's license. Due to the fact that unconventional vehicle are allowed to be operated, this DOES NOT mean that four-wheelers, dirt bikes and other type vehicles are allowed on the roadways. If they do not fall under the four described vehicles listed above, they are PROHIBITED from being on the roadway.
